A STORY OF TRANSFORMATIONAL CHANGE

Over the last 12 months, FPA India's programmes, to get girls back to school, impacted thousands of young people positively.

With its participation in the **TATA Mumbai Marathon 2018**, FPA India was looking to impact one of the most important segments of the population—adolescents and young adults. The theme was **'Let's Get Girls Back to School'.** We delivered a comprehensive programme which included life skills training through the 'Adolescent Education Programme Plus (AEP+)', distribution of sanitary napkins, tackling anaemia in school-going girls, and providing outreach-based health services.
